INTRODUCTION

PSHEE stands for Personal, Social, Health , Economic Education.

The Education Act 2002 (section 78) states that all schools should deliver a PSHEE programme in order to fulfil the statutory responsibility to support students' spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development and prepare them for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life.

There are 3 core themes in PSHEE that run through Key Stages 1– 5 and will be taught through a variety of topics . The themes are:

Core theme 1. Health & Well-being

Core theme 2. Relationships

Core theme 3. Living in the Wider World.

At Key Stage 3, students will build on the skills, attitudes, values, knowledge and understanding they have acquired and developed during Primary school.

In PSHEE, we will address the changes that young people experience, beginning with transition to secondary school, the challenges of adolescence and their increasing independence. In addition key elements of the wider world to include Careers, SMSC and British Values.

These are key skills that will help equip them for opportunities and challenges of life. There will be a number of drop down days which will include STEM days.

We will also have an enrichment week which will incorporate cover key themes as well as team work, leadership opportunities .
